BOARD SECRETARY REPORT

Board Secretary John Susino informed the Board that the School Ethics Commission requires all board members and administrative staff members that make personnel and purchasing decisions to complete *Personal and Financial Disclosure Forms*. In the month of February, these individuals will receive an email with instructions on how to complete the disclosure statements. Although the deadline to complete the statements is April 30, 2022, Mr. Susino requested that forms be completed well in advance of the deadline as they need to be reviewed by not only his office, but that of the County Superintendent's office as well.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Harassment, Intimidation, Bullying (HIB) Report
 - The District is required to report specific incidents of harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying to the Board of Education. This past month we did not have any HIB investigations.
- <u>District Information, Accolades and Other Important Communications</u>
 - COVID Update
 - As you are well aware New Jersey has been experiencing a significant uptick in COVID cases due to the Omicron variant. Our school district has experienced higher number of positive cases over the past two weeks; however I am pleased to report that we have not had to switch to remote learning for our schools.
 - We continue to diligently enforce all of our mitigation and contact tracing protocols; therefore we are able to implement targeted quarantines which result in fewer students needing to revert to remote learning.
 - We are fortunate in that we have the level of staffing needed on site each day so that inperson learning has been able to continue
 - Last week we put out new guidance to staff & families regarding reduced quarantine time based on NJ & Bergen County DOH recommendations.

- o It is our hope that this will enable us to have as many students and staff in person as possible.
- Our educational staff across the district continues to do a phenomenal job teaching and supporting our students whether they are in school or at home due to quarantine
- o Our administrators have worked to ensure that all safety protocols and procedures are in place
- And again, I must commend our custodial and maintenance staff and supervisors who continue to work tirelessly to keep our buildings clean and safe.

• District Enrollment

- On a positive note, despite COVID and other difficulties school districts are experiencing, our district enrollment continues to steadily increase.
- o Central administration tracks enrollment on a weekly basis.
- o At the end of September we had 642 students enrolled
- This past week it had increased to 659.
- I attribute this to the quality of the educational services that are schools provide due to the outstanding efforts of our administration and staff.

• Superintendent's Goal (TECHNOLOGY) - Progress Report

 2021-2022 Superintendent's Technology Goal - Social Media: By June 2022, the Superintendent will develop and implement a social media program to increase awareness of the many great student accomplishments and school programs in the Bergen County Services School District.

Evidence of Completion: A summary report on the superintendent's social media program.

Mid-Year Update: A social media point person has been established for each campus. Each social media point person has been given access to their respective social media platforms and trained on how to use the social media platforms. Each program is expected to create social media posts at least twice a week. Facebook Business suite is currently being used to track posts and monitor activity.

The main tasks that still need to be completed are to consolidate inactive social media accounts in BCSS, to implement Instagram across all the programs and to start collaborations between the campuses to create joint media campaigns during holidays and school events.

 2021-2022 Superintendent's Technology Goal - Technology Audit: By June 2022, the Superintendent will ensure a full technology audit is conducted in which 100% of all hardware, software, and infrastructure in the district will be identified, evaluated and cataloged. This audit will identify strengths and weaknesses to allow the superintendent to make certain that the district is fully prepared for the future technology demands of the special services district and ensure that students and staff have uninterrupted access to technology at all times during the school year.

Evidence of Completion: A summary report of the comprehensive audit will be provided to the Board of Education.

Mid-Year Update: Currently the Technology Department is on schedule for completing a full technology audit by June 2022. Working with Dellicker Strategies the Technology Department has successfully built a team with established roles and responsibilities. The team developed the goals and process for collecting the necessary data for a complete inventory. All hardware, software, and infrastructure will be identified, evaluated and cataloged. As each location is completed, a review is conducted of the errors, omissions and the inventory is

updated. The three main tasks that still need to be completed are data collection from all BCSS sites, preliminary data analysis and evaluation, and the development of policies and procedures to ensure we are prepared for future technology demands. The team expects to complete these three tasks in the coming months.
